Prologue

The Utah Amateur Radio Club was organized under its present name in 1927, although its beginnings may date back as early as 1909. In 1928, it became affiliated with the American Radio Relay League (club #1602) and is a non-profit organization under the laws of Utah. It holds a club station license with the call W7SP, a memorial call for Leonard (Zim) Zimmerman, an amateur radio pioneer in the Salt Lake City Area.

Meetings: The club meets each month except July and August. The meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month at 7:30 PM in the University of Utah's Warnock Engineering Building in room 1230, The "Duke Classroom."

Membership: Club membership is open to anyone interested in amateur radio; a current license is not required. Dues are \$17 per year, including a *Microvolt* subscription. *The Microvolt* and membership cannot be separated. Those living at the same address as a member who has paid \$17 may obtain a membership without a *Microvolt* subscription for \$9. Repeaters: UARC maintains the 146.62- and 146.76- repeaters. The repeaters are administered by the UARC Repeater Committee. Comments and questions may be directed to any Committee member. The Lake Mountain repeater (146.76-) has autopatch facilities for Provo which are currently disabled due to abuse and for Salt Lake which is in need of reworking to be compatible with IRLP.

November Meeting: Rockport & Wanship Telegraph Co. (symbol RWTC)

Radiotelegraphy's parent is, of course, wire telegraphy. Recently Dick Leining, W7DML, and Bruce Longstroth, N7FJG, gave a demonstration, ala 1860's. Dick writes:

The November meeting of the Utah Amateur Radio Club (UARC), occurring so long after July 27, 2008, and so far from Summit County, Utah, may seem like anticlimax. The Company's antique capital of less than \$1000, rescued from creditors, investors, and sheriff's deputies at the Mountain Spirit Heritage Festival, Rockport State Park, will be displayed at the meeting.

The principals (Dick Leining, W7DML, and Bruce Longstroth, N7FJG) will surface long enough to describe meteoric careers in landline telegraphy. No spring chickens themselves, they will advise members how to cope with middle-age burnout. In the spirit of country first, they have consented to hands-on operation of surviving equipment by members who wish to send and receive 100% American Morse. (Use of International/Continental Code will be tolerated in cases of Central-European ancestry.) The speakers cannot, regrettably, distribute unregistered securities in Utah but as consolation will project illustrations and offer golden message forms.




Michael Robinson, KE7AQL shows his RS232-to-TTL converter for interfacing rig to computer.




Bob Harbrecht, KE7QEQ, has an extensible J-Pole


Bob shows a solar panel/battery/inverter package.
