Club: The Utah Amateur Radio Club was organized under its present name in 1927, although its beginnings may date back as early as 1909. In 1928, it became affiliated with the American Radio Relay League (club #1602) and is a non-profit organization under the laws of Utah. It holds a club station license with the call W7SP, a memorial call for Leonard (Zim) Zimmerman, an amateur radio pioneer in the Salt Lake City area.

Meetings: The club meets each month except July and August. The meetings are held on the second Thursday of the month at 7:30 PM in the University of Utah's Warnock Engineering Building, generally in room 1230 or 2230., sometimes in 2250 or 105.

Membership: Club membership is open to anyone interested in amateur radio; a current license is not required. Dues are \$17 per year, including a *Microvolt* subscription. *The Microvolt* and membership cannot be separated. Those living at the same address as a member who has paid \$17 may obtain a membership without a *Microvolt* subscription for \$9. October Meeting: Homebrew Night

It's coming October 10: UARC's annual Homebrew Night! This is the event where folks who have been building their own amateur radio equipment have an opportunity to show everyone what they have constructed and explain the features and capabilities. Even if you haven't had your soldering iron heated up recently, you will want to come see what others have done.

Each person displaying something will have about five minutes to show and explain it. If it's too big or well-anchored to bring in, then bring in photos, block diagrams, flow charts, or whatever it takes make the project clear to the audience. We will have the digital projector available and can probably display most common varieties of computer files.

Anything that can be used in amateur radio and has not been shown at a previous UARC Homebrew Night is eligible to show. Good projects include power supplies, power amplifiers, keyers, transverters, mike preamps (for those rigs that are eternally deficient in transmit audio), and, of course, antennas. That's Thursday, October 10, at 7:30 P.M. in room 2230 (the "Clark" classroom) of the Warnock Engineering Building.

Last month we had a problem that the front elevator had the second floor locked out. There are two possible solutions for the handicapped. The first is to get into the elevator and then send an able-bodied person to the second floor to call the elevator. The second is to find your way to the elevator in the southwest corner of the building and use it to access the second floor.

UARC meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month at 7:30 P.M., in the Warnock Engineering Building on the University of Utah campus. The fall, 2013, meetings are scheduled in room 2230. See the map for information on finding the building. The room number varies depending on availability.
