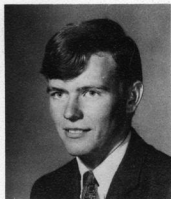
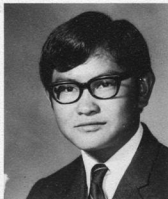
## "time for us" sets stage for annual senior dance

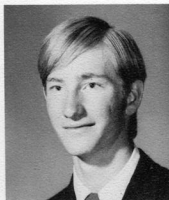
## seniors accept leadership roles for school affairs

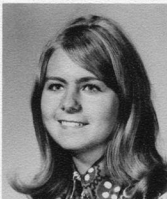
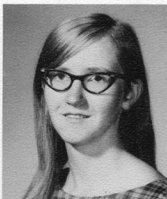
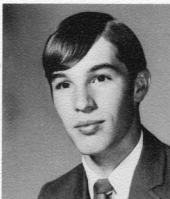
## post high school events challenge upper classmen

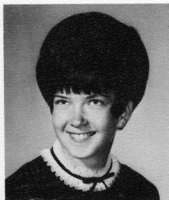
## class of 1970 joins list of illustrious graduates
